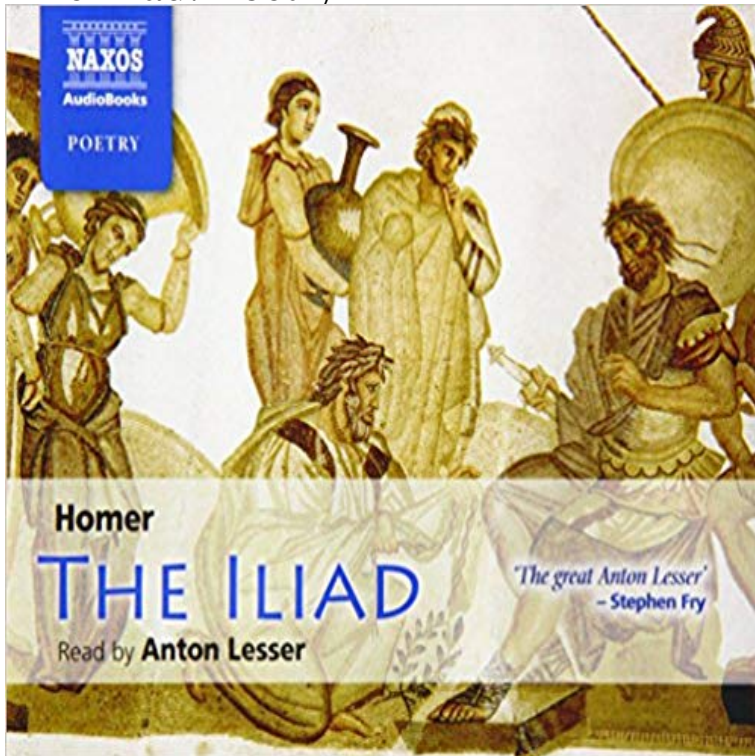


The Iliad: Poetry
