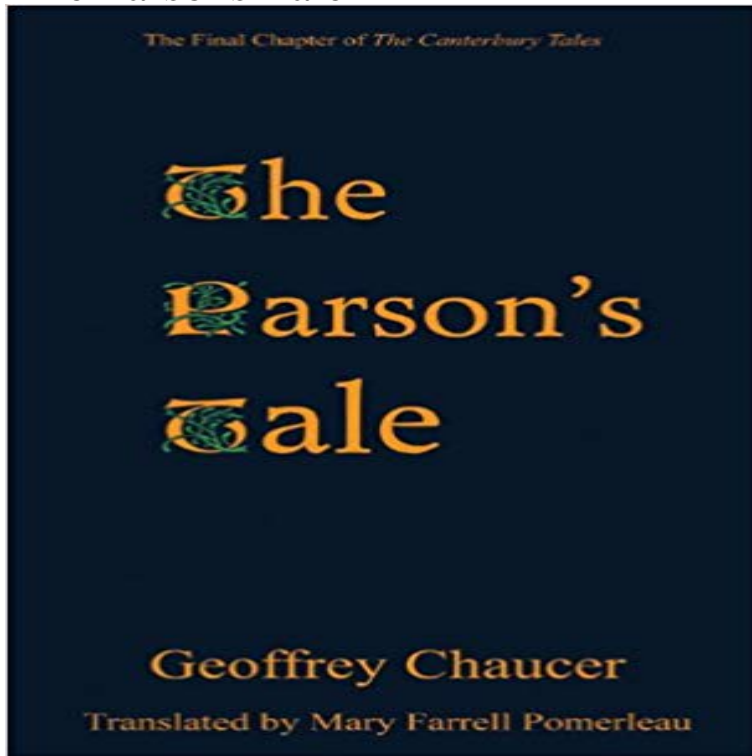


The Parsons Tale
