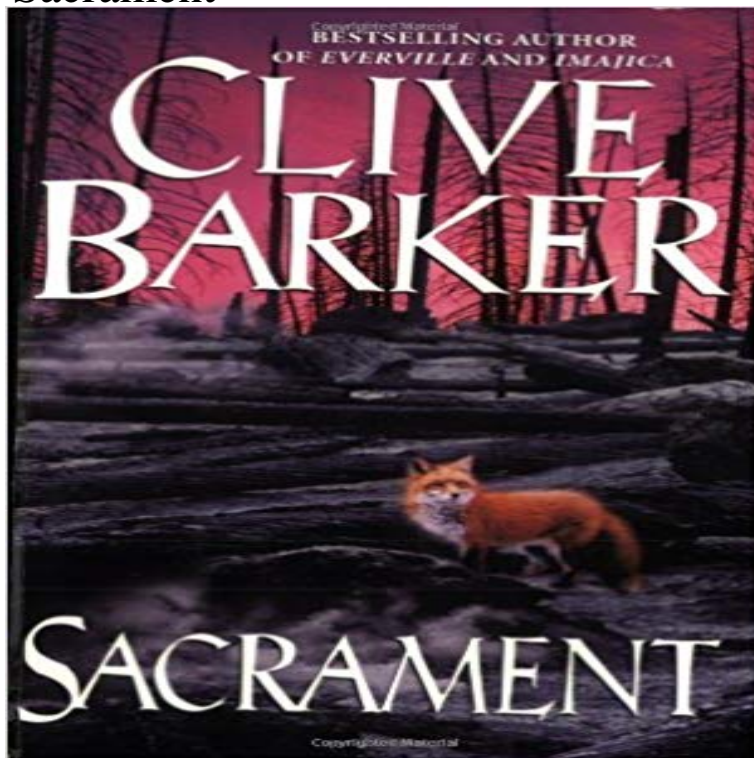


Sacrament
